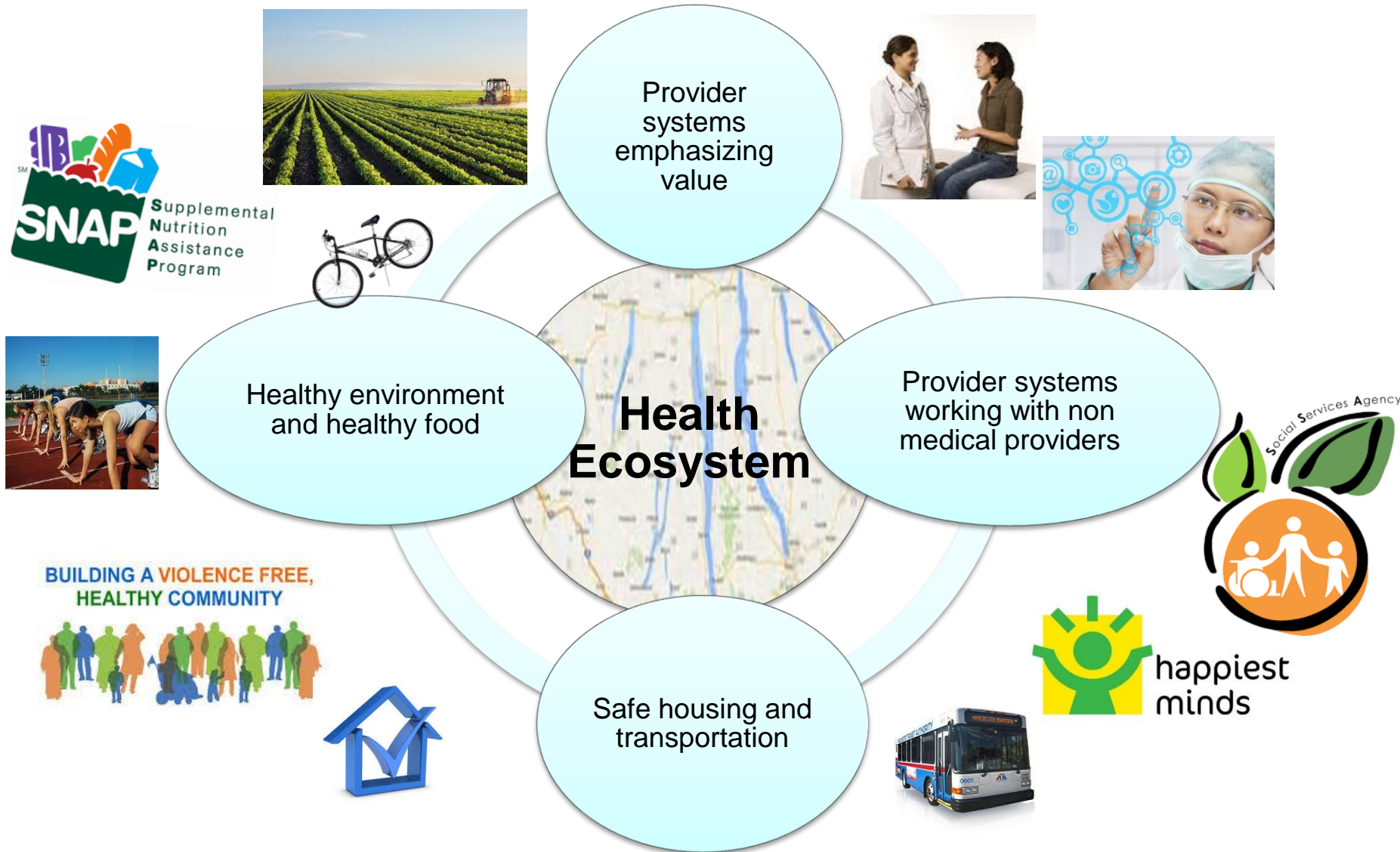

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**Stewardship:** Leaders in regions who work together as stewards of a common system, across boundaries and vested interests, to foster greater health, equity and economic well-being

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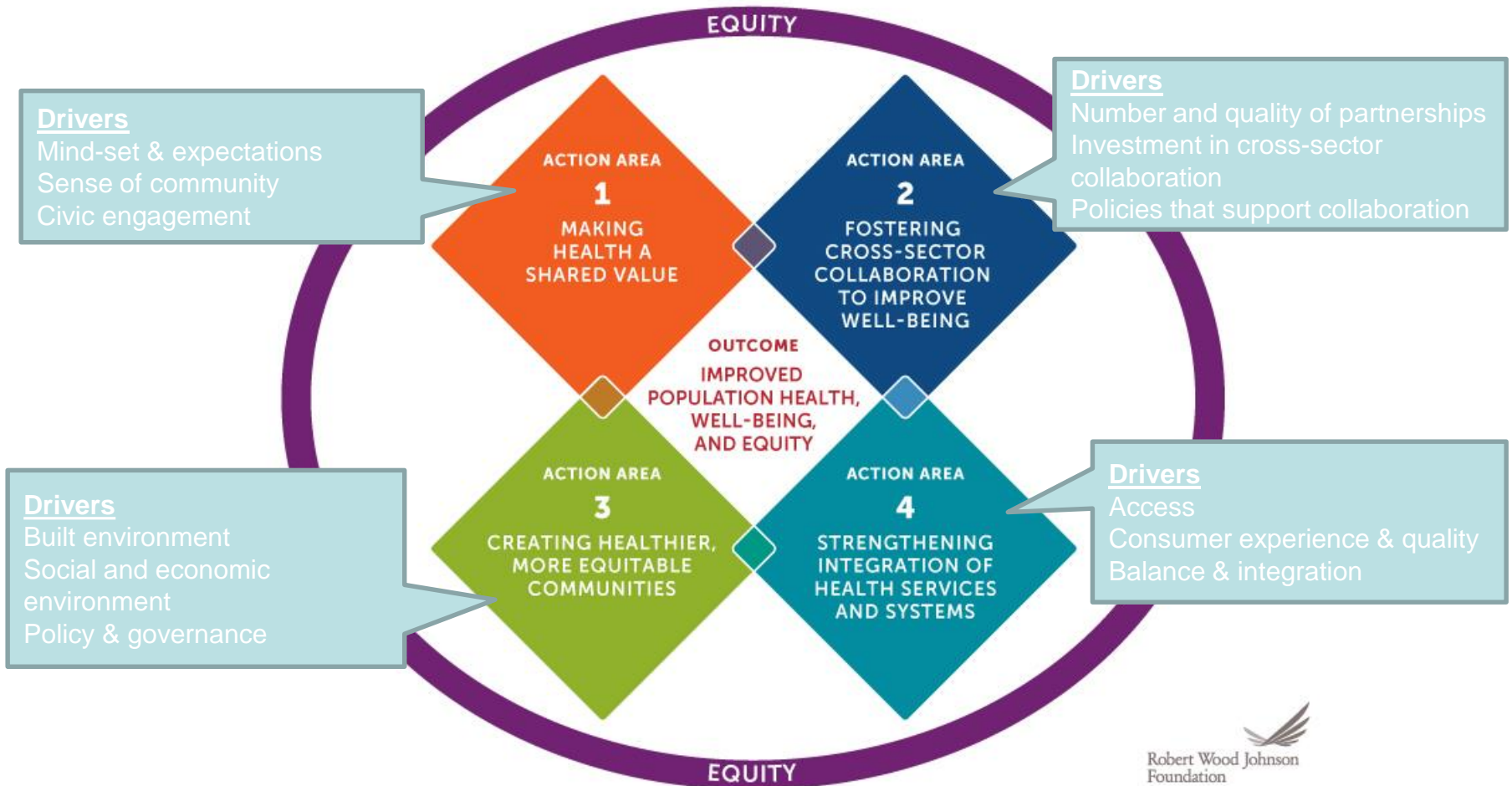
**Strategy:** Agreement on a clear course of action for the region, with priorities that deliver intended results over time, avoiding significant pitfalls or unacceptable tradeoffs

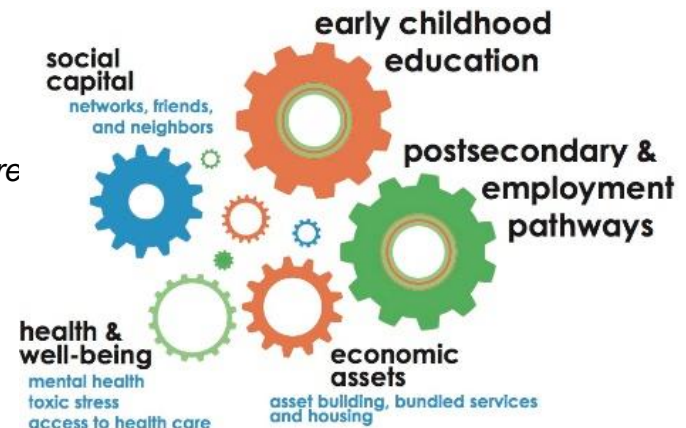

# New evidence that multi-sector collaboration impacts population health

- Researchers measured a set of 20 different population health activities recommended for implementation by a network of organizations and sectors
- Communities achieving broad activity by dense multi-sector networks experienced significantly lower potentially preventable death rates over a 16 year period
